

Family Guide to Addressing Concerns



Classroom or **Activity Concern**

Issues related to your child's classroom, or club/team.

Teacher or Advisor/Coach

Issue Resolved?







For a concern about athletics, go to the Athletic Director for WMS or XHS.

For all other concerns, go to your building principal.





Building Concern

Issues related to your child's school, including building procedures, processes, safety.

Go to District level.

Note: For disputes that cannot be resolved at the building level, families may choose to reach out directly to the district ombudsman. (see below)



District Concern

Issues or questions related to curriculum, student services, special education, facilities and grounds, cafeteria services, transportation, HR, finance, safety, discipline, and other district-wide functions.

About the District Ombudsman

The role of the ombudsman is to serve as a resource for families to resolve disputes and concerns that cannot be resolved at the school level. Keep in mind that teachers and principals are often in the best position to support your student, but families can contact the ombudsman for assistance: 1) if they have exhausted all efforts to resolve concerns at the building level, 2) if they feel strongly that they need mediation, or 3) if they believe that a district policy has been violated.

Board of Education FAQs for Parents

What is the role of the BOE?

The Board of Education deals directly with issues related to policy, district goals, spending priorities, and overall leadership and direction for the district. It oversees the Superintendent and Treasurer, but does <u>not</u> get directly involved in operational concerns.

How does district leadership work together?

While school boards are not involved in day-to-day district operations, the board is ultimately accountable for how schools perform. The board does this by setting the vision, goals, and policy for the district, including establishing spending priorities.

The superintendent is the chief executive for the district, and handles day-to-day operations and oversees all staff. The superintendent provides leadership and expertise, regularly making recommendations to the board. Ultimately, the superintendent answers directly to the board, and implements all board policies and directives.

What is my role as a parent/guardian?

Parents are natural advocates for their students, and may always bring concerns to the appropriate school staff member or department. It is important for families to understand that the district follows policies and protocols that are based on federal and state law, as well as best practices to support students, and that resolution of any concerns must fall within those guidelines across the district.

Not sure who to contact about a specific concern? It depends on the issue, so be sure to check the chart on the reverse of this document for the best place to start!
